

Maths – Place Value/Addition and Subtraction

- interpret negative numbers in context, count forwards and backwards with positive and negative whole numbers, including through zero
- count forwards or backwards in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1 000 000
- read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1 000 000 and determine the value of each digit
- read Roman numerals to 1 000 (M) and recognise years written in Roman numerals.
- round any number up to 1 000 000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1 000, 10 000 and 100 000
- round decimals with two decimal places to the nearest whole number and to one decimal place
- solve number problems and practical problems that involve all of the above
- add and subtract numbers mentally with increasingly large numbers add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods
- use rounding to check answers to calculations and determine, in the context of a problem, levels of accuracy
- solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why

EnglishReading Comprehension – Class Novel – Kick!

- To be able distinguish fact and opinion
- continuing to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks
- drawing inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence
- predicting what might happen from details stated and implied
- summarising the main ideas drawn from more than 1 paragraph, identifying key details that support the main ideas
- identifying how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning
- retrieve, record and present information from non-fiction

Writing – A Tragedy and a Biography

- using expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information concisely
- use a range of fronted adverbials
- using modal verbs or adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility
- ensuring the consistent and correct use of tense throughout a piece of writing
- ensuring correct subject and verb agreement when using singular and plural, distinguishing between the language of speech and writing and choosing the appropriate register
- in narratives, describing settings, characters and atmosphere and integrating dialogue to convey character and advance the action
- précis longer passages
- using a wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs
- identifying the audience for and purpose of the writing, selecting the appropriate form and using other similar writing as models for their own
